



ISC FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What is World Youth Alliance (WYA)?

World Youth Alliance (WYA) is a coalition of young people between the ages of 10-30 committed to promoting human dignity in policy and culture. WYA started with Anna Halpine, who stood up for her belief in the dignity of the person at the United Nations in 1999. Today, WYA has spread to six regions and continues to attract young people who wish to defend the dignity of the person through advocacy, education and culture.

2. Who is eligible to apply for the ISC?

The WYA International Summer Camp is open to all applicants age 13-18 years old. We highly encourage high school students and university students to apply. We welcome campers from all cities and all countries all over the world.

3. What are the expected activities? What is the schedule like?

The summer camp will comprise of training on human dignity and how this idea is the starting point for change in the world through engaging and fun activities. Outdoor excursions include a hiking trip in Upstate New York, boating in Central Park, and visiting some of New York's finest attractions. Camp days will begin at 9:00am and, depending on the day's agenda, can run until 10:00pm at night.

4. Is there a scholarship for the summer camp fee?

5. Does WYA cover travel and visa costs?

Summer campers are responsible for their own travel and visa costs going to and from New York City. WYA will be able to provide a letter of invitation if necessary for visa applications.

6. What are the arrangements for pick up or drop off at nearby airports?
